Monmouthshire's first Walking Festival

Monmouthshire remains relatively undiscovered as a walking county. The Monmouthshire Walking Festival aims to share the wisdom with over thirty walks spread over ten days between Friday 22nd and Sunday 31st October. Each day provides one long walk and a couple of shorter walks, plus a few extra choices, including self-guided walks for a bit of variety.

The festival's featured walk is an exploration of the county boundary. As nearly as possible, with a couple of detours, we will explore the border of Monmouthshire, a ten stage journey which takes in the full variety of the county's landscape. (All those completing the journey will receive a special certificate.)

Whichever walk or walks you choose to do, you can rest assured that all will be led by experienced, qualified walk leaders and first-aiders. Monmouthshire County Council's Countryside Section has overseen their training, and indeed devised the programme of walks, to ensure your enjoyment and safety during the festival.

At the back of this programme you'll find a booking form; you may book onto as many or as few walks as you like but places on walks are limited so prior booking is essential. Walks will be booked on a first come, first served basis, so get looking and get booking now.

As an added incentive, all those booking places on or by 30th June, 2010, will be entered into a prize draw to win one of two prizes, either: a luxury two-night stay for two, at any time during the festival, at The Angel Hotel, Abergavenny, or, a three-night break for six from 29th October, staying in beautiful accommodation just outside Abergavenny, managed by Brecon Beacons Holiday Cottages.

1 Undy to Chepstow via the Monmouthshire section of the Wales Coastal Path

On this **11.5 mile (18km)** walk you will follow part of the newly created Wales Coastal Path. Enjoy great views across the River Severn and find out more about its folklore, history and wildlife. Journey inland through the historic village of Mathern with its Bishops Palaces, church and ancient well. Continue on to reach Chepstow, finishing at the town's famous castle. A few stiles. No steep slopes.

Time: approx 6hrs

2 Pwllmeyric to Mounon and Great Barnets Wood

On this **4 mile (6.5km)** walk you will cross fields to the village of Mounon, famous for its paper mills. You will enter Great Barnets Wood before returning via fields and lanes with views over the Severn Estuary along the way. Lots of stiles and one steep slope.

Time: am 2hrs

3 Chepstow Town and Country

Self Guided

An easy "barrier free" **1.15 mile (2.1km)** route around Chepstow town looking at the history and wildlife. Find out about the towns fascinating history, its importance as a port on the River Wye, and how it was the first place in Wales to have a stone castle. One uphill and one downhill slope.

Time: From 10am at the TIC



4 Monmouth to Chepstow along the Wye Valley Walk

Catch the minibus from Chepstow to Monmouth for a chance to enjoy an exhilarating **17 mile (27.25 km)** walk through the world renowned Wye Valley gorge. Starting in Monmouth, you will follow the banks of the river before climbing up the side of the gorge to follow the ridge and descend into Tintern village, with its historic Abbey. Climb once more to reach the "Eagle's Nest" viewpoint with fantastic views down the gorge to the River Severn. Finally you will descend the 365 steps and follow the newly restored picturesque 18th Century tourist trail to Chepstow. Lots of stiles. 2 steep slopes.

Time: Approx 7hrs

6 St. Arvans and Penterry

On this **5 mile (8 km)** walk you will follow part of the 18th Century tourist trail through Piercefield Estate and ascend the 365 steps to the "Eagle's Nest" with fantastic views down the Wye Valley to the Severn. You will also pass an ancient church and hill fort on your return to St. Arvans. Lots of stiles. One steep slope.

Time: am 3hrs

Walk leader is an Edward Llywd Society Welsh speaker.

5 Brockweir to Chepstow along the Wye Valley Walk

Catch the minibus from Chepstow before enjoying a shorter, but no less enjoyable **7 mile (11.25 km)** walk along the Wye Valley Walk. From Brockweir you will pass through Tintern village, with its historic Abbey. You will climb to the top of the ridge to reach the "Eagle's Nest" viewpoint with fantastic views down the gorge to the coast. Finally you will descend the 365 steps and follow the newly restored picturesque 18th Century tourist trail to Chepstow. Lots of stiles. One steep slope.

Time: am 4hrs

7 Old Station, Tintern to Tintern village

Starting this **3 mile (5 km)** walk from the Old Railway Station, you will follow the River Wye before walking through the village of Tintern to reach the remains of the Abbey. You will then cross the river and ascend onto the Monk's trail to Brockweir village. After passing the site of the old quay you will cross the river again before returning along the railway line to the Old Station. No stiles. A mainly level walk, with one short, steep section.

Time: pm 2hrs

A dog friendly walk

8 Llandogo

This **2.5 mile (4km)** walk starts by following a stretch of the River Wye before ascending through the village to the “bread and cheese” view point, crossing over Cleddon Shoots waterfalls then zig zagging back down to the village on the Jubilee Walk. A few stiles. One steep slope.

Time: am 3hrs

Overlooking the Wye.

9 Piercefield and St. Arvans Romantic singles walk

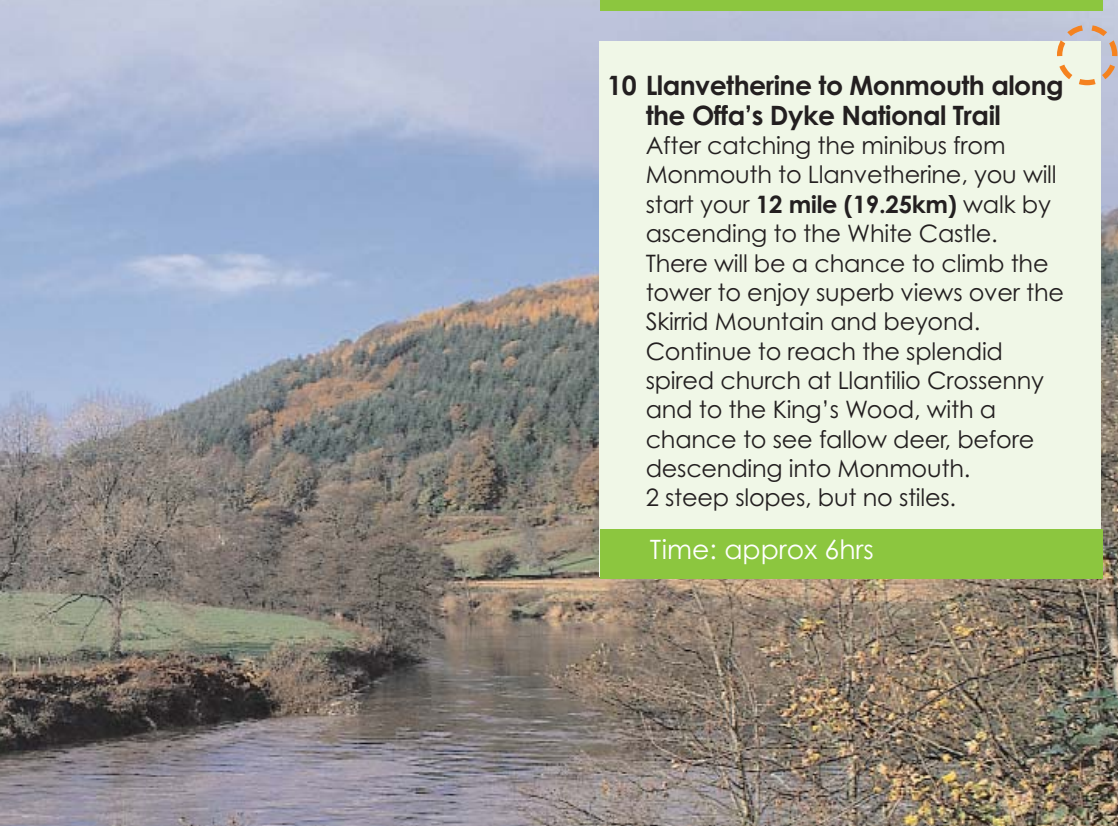
On this **5 mile (8km)** walk you will go through Chepstow Racecourse before passing the ruins of Piercefield House, following the 18th Century trail with it's magnificent viewpoints including “The Alcove” and “Lovers Leap”. After passing through the village of St. Arvans you will return to Chepstow via fields and woodland. A few stiles and fairly flat route.

Time: pm 3hrs

10 Llanvetherine to Monmouth along the Offa's Dyke National Trail

After catching the minibus from Monmouth to Llanvetherine, you will start your **12 mile (19.25km)** walk by ascending to the White Castle. There will be a chance to climb the tower to enjoy superb views over the Skirid Mountain and beyond. Continue to reach the splendid spired church at Llantilio Crossenny and to the King's Wood, with a chance to see fallow deer, before descending into Monmouth. 2 steep slopes, but no stiles.

Time: approx 6hrs



11 Skenfrith to Monmouth along the Monnow Valley Walk

Catch the minibus from Monmouth to Skenfrith, a charming village with an historic mill, church and castle on the banks of the River Monnow. For this **10 mile (16 km)** walk you will climb steeply onto the ridge for fantastic views over the Monnow Valley, then continue through fields to follow the river to Rockfield and on to Monmouth, where the river enters the Wye. Lots of stiles and one steep section.

Time: approx 5hrs

12 Mitchel Troy to Cwmcarvan

On this **5 mile (8 km)** walk you will start at Mitchel Troy village and ascend via a steep footpath to Craig y Dorth Hill from which you will enjoy some of the most magnificent views over the Black Mountains and Monmouthshire. Continue down into the next valley before ascending to Cwmcarvan church. Your return route will wend through fields and lanes with more fantastic views. Lots of stiles and three steep slopes.

Time: am 3hrs

13 Rolls of Monmouth town and country, self guided walk

An easy "barrier free" **1.5 mile (2.5 km)** route around Monmouth town looking at the history and wildlife. Find out about its association with a famous car producer and a Plantagenet king. Cross its ancient bridge and find out more about the natural history of its two rivers.

Time: pm 2hrs

14 Three Castles Walk (Part 1) Skenfrith to Llanfair Green via White Castle

This **10 mile (16 km)** undulating walk starts at the picturesque village of Skenfrith on the banks of the River Monnow. You will follow a section of the old stagecoach route from London to Haverfordwest before reaching the magnificent, isolated White Castle then continuing through pasture to pass Glen Trothy House.

Time: approx 6hrs

15 Buckholt Wood

This **5.5 mile (8.75 km)** walk takes you through farmland and tracks before climbing into Buckholt Wood. Leaving the wood you will enjoy views over the mountains of Abergavenny and the Black Mountains beyond. Continuing down through fields, you will follow the River Monnow before returning to Monmouth town. Lots of stiles and one steep slope. Can be muddy under foot.

Time: am 3hrs

Join poet Ric Hool on a walk in the stunning landscape that inspires his work. He will be reading extracts at various points in the walk and give insights of how writing can connect with a "spirit" or "sense" of place. Ric is the author of five collections of poetry.

16 Drybridge Nature Park and the King's Wood

This **5.5 mile (9 km)** route starts with a walk through the town's community nature reserve. You will continue across fields and green lanes before climbing up into the King's Wood. There are splendid views as you leave the wood to return to the town. Lots of stiles and one steep slope.

Time: pm 3hrs

17 Three Castles Walk (Part 2) Llanfair Green to Skenfrith via Grosmont

This strenuous **10 mile (16 km)** walk involves two steep ascents of the Graig Hill, but the climb is well worth it because you will enjoy spectacular views across to the Black Mountains on the first ascent and across Monmouthshire and Herefordshire on the second. There will also be an opportunity to visit the unusual church and castle at Grosmont as well as Skenfrith castle. Lots of stiles. Two long, steep slopes.

Time: approx 6hrs

18 Kymin and Biblins

A **9 mile (14km)** walk starting with a steep uphill stretch to the Kymin to enjoy spectacular views across Monmouth and the Monnow Valley. Continue through woodland and return to Monmouth meandering along the banks of the beautiful river Wye. Lots of stiles. One steep slope.

Time: am 5hrs

19 A choice of two walks from the village of Raglan

Castle and countryside

This **5 mile (8 km)** walk through undulating countryside crosses fields and travels along green lanes with splendid views of the castle from all angles.

A few stiles. Can be muddy under foot.

Time: am 2hrs

20 Healthy Footsteps

The **1.5 mile (2.5 km)** "healthy footsteps" trail on the edge of the village passes through fields and along lanes and pavements. With great views of the castle and the mountains beyond.

No stiles. Flat.

Time: pm 1hr

21 Pandy to Llanthony along the Offa's Dyke National Trail

After catching the minibus from Abergavenny to Pandy, you will climb steadily on this challenging **6 mile (9.5kms)** walk to reach the Hatterall Ridge with fantastic views across Herefordshire to the Malvern Hills. You will pass through an iron age hill fort and continue onto heath moorland. Find out how it's managed and look out for red grouse. Eventually you will descend into the secretive Vale of Ewyas, finishing at the picturesque ruin of Llanthony Priory. A few stiles. One steep slope.

Time: am 4hrs

22 White Castle and Great Trerhew

This **3 mile (5kms)** walk includes entrance to the White Castle, a tour of the Great Trerhew Barn and the new Vineyard at Court Farm. Rolling farmland, riverside walk and a gentle climb up to the White Castle with views to reward you from every angle

Time: pm 4¹/₂ hrs

23 Abergavenny town and country

An easy "barrier free" **1.15 mile (2.75 km)** route around Abergavenny town looking at the history and wildlife. Find out about the massacre at the castle and the wildlife in and around the River Usk which runs by the town.

Time: from 10am at the TIC

Buggy friendly

24 Usk Valley Walk (Part 1) Chainbridge to Abergavenny

Catch the minibus from Abergavenny to Chainbridge. This **11.5 mile (18.5 km)** section of the walk follows the river to Clytha and continues via roads and fields to the village of Llanellen. Here you will climb up to, and follow, the Monmouthshire and Brecon Canal, before leaving it at Llanfoist and continuing to Abergavenny. Lots of stiles. One short steep slope.

Time: approx 6 hrs

25 Sugar Loaf Mountain

A **6.5 mile (10.5 km)** walk along lanes and through a magical oak woodland, then up onto the Deri Ridge to enjoy fantastic views over England. Continue to the summit of Sugar Loaf to enjoy views of the Black Mountains, Abergavenny and the Usk Valley. Return via Y Rholben Ridge. 2 steep slopes. No stiles

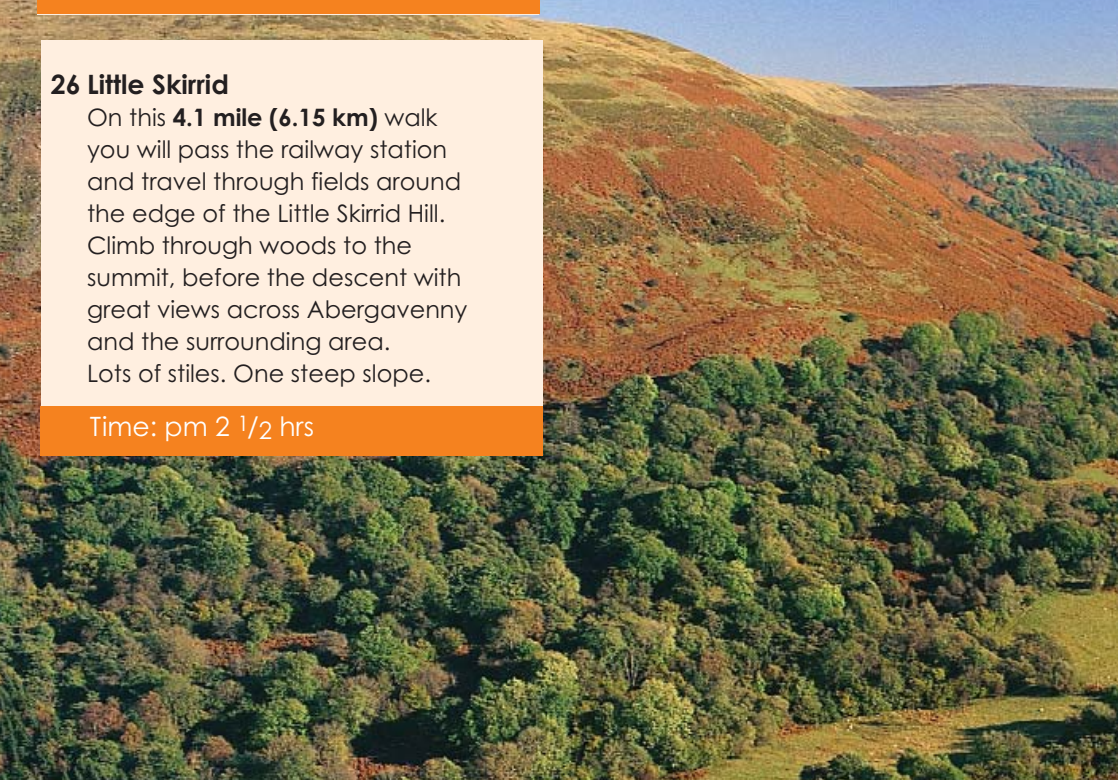
Time: am 5 hrs

Dog friendly walk

26 Little Skirrid

On this **4.1 mile (6.15 km)** walk you will pass the railway station and travel through fields around the edge of the Little Skirrid Hill. Climb through woods to the summit, before the descent with great views across Abergavenny and the surrounding area. Lots of stiles. One steep slope.

Time: pm 2 1/2 hrs



27 Usk Valley Walk (Part 2) Llantrisant to Chainbridge

Catch the minibus from Abergavenny to Llantrisant before following another **12.5 mile (20 km)** section of the Usk Valley Walk. Travel through fields to Llanllowell, before following a lane to reach Usk. Continue across country to reach Chainbridge, and the bus back to Abergavenny. Lots of stiles. No steep slopes.

Time: approx 6 1/2 hrs

28 Gilwern and the Clydach Gorge

This **6 Mile (10 km)** walk follows the River Clydach along the old tram road from Gilwern to Clydach and continues on to Black Rock, before returning via the old railway line, a beech woodland and the former Clydach Ironworks.

A few stiles. On steep slope.

Time: pm 3 hrs

29 Abergavenny to the Skirrid Mountain

On this **9 mile (14.5 km)** walk you will follow part of the "Marches Way" to the base of the Skirrid. Climb up through oak woodland and follow the ridge to the top. Discover the folklore and history associated with the mountain and enjoy brilliant views towards Monmouth to the south and Abergavenny and the Black Mountains to the north. Return via fields and lanes, with a stop at the Court Cupboard gallery on the way back to Abergavenny. Lots of stiles. One long steep slope.

Time: am 6 hrs



30 Govilon and the Bloreng

On this **9 mile (14.5 km)** walk you will follow the old railway line to Govilon before ascending the Bloreng mountain. Enjoy fantastic views over Abergavenny and the Brecon Beacons. Return via the enchanting Punch Bowl pond and an old tramway incline. A few stiles and one very steep slope.

Time: am 6 hrs

31 Castle Meadows and Govilon

On this **5 mile (8 km)** walk you will cross the Castle Meadows on the edge of Abergavenny before following the old railway line to Govilon. Return via a section of the Monmouthshire and Brecon Canal. No stiles. No steep gradients. One flight of steps.

Time: pm 2hrs

Dog friendly walk

32 Llantrisant to Caerwent

Catch the minibus from Caerwent to Llantrisant before commencing the **9 mile (14.5 km)** final part of our walk around the county. Ascend the Wentwood Ridge to enjoy fantastic views North over Monmouthshire and the mountains beyond. After passing through woodland, you will ascend Grey Hill with its stone circle and splendid views South and East across the Bristol Channel. Continue downhill to finish at the Roman town of Caerwent. Lots of stiles. 2 steep slopes.

Time: approx 6hrs
